Top Tips



Ewch â thortsh gyda chi.

Gallwch ei defnyddio i weld y llwybr, nid i ddod o hyd i'r ystumod. Maent yn sensitif i'r golau ac efallai y bydd golau tortsh llachar yn eu hatal rhag gadael eu clywd i chwilio am fwyd.

Gwylwch yn dawel, o bellter.

Defnyddiwch synhwyrdd ystumod os oes gennych un. Maent yn rhwydd i'w prynu. (Ymwelwch â www.bats.org.uk am fwy o wybodaeth).

Edrychwch yn uchel ac yn isel

- bydd gwahanol ystumod yn hedfan ar wahanol uchder.

Gwrandewch!

Pa greaduriaid y nos eraill allwch chi eu clywed? Cadnoaid yn cyfarth? Tylluanod yn hwntian? Draenogod yn snwffian?

Take a torch. Use it to find your way, not to find bats. They are sensitive to light and bright torchlight may discourage them from leaving their roost in search of food.

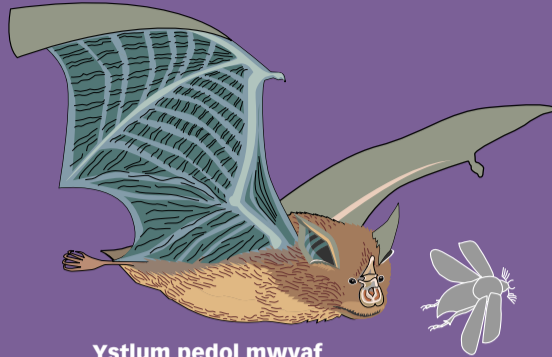
Observe quietly from a distance

Use a bat detector if you have one. They are widely available. (Go to www.bats.org.uk for more information)

Look high and low - different bats fly at different heights

Listen! What other night creatures can you hear? Foxes barking? Owls hooting? Badgers snuffling?

Ystumod yw 'adar y nos'. Maent yn gwneud yr un math o waith ag adar trwy fwyta pryfetach, peillio blodau a hau hadau. Mae Sir Benfro'n gartref i 12 o'r 18 rhywogaeth o ystum a geir yn y DU, o'r Ystum Pedol Mwyaf, sy'n rhywogaeth ar drengi, i'r Corystum Cyffredin, a cheir tua 1000 o drigolion yn y nythfa fwyaf.

Bats are the 'birds of the night'. They do much the same jobs as birds by eating insects, pollinating flowers and spreading seeds. Pembrokeshire is home to 12 of the 18 species of bat found in the UK, ranging from the critically endangered Greater horseshoe to the Common pipistrelle. The largest colony has about 1000 residents.

Funky Facts

Hedfan fry
Yr ystum yw'r unig famal all hedfan.

Llygaid a chlustiau
'Dyw ystumod ddim yn ddall! Mae eu golwg yn dda, ond mae eu clyw yn well fyth.

High-flier
Bats are the only mammals that can fly.

Eyes and Ears
Bats are **not** blind! They have good eyesight, but even better hearing.



Corrach bach
Y Corystum yw'r ystum lleiaf yn Sir Benfro. Mae'n 4cm o hyd.

Pip-squeak
Pipistrelles are the smallest bat in Pembrokeshire. They are only 4cm long.

Mmm... gwybed!
Gall y Corystum fwyta hyd at 3000 o wybed mewn un noson!

Midge-munchers
Pipistrelles can eat up to 3000 midges in one night!

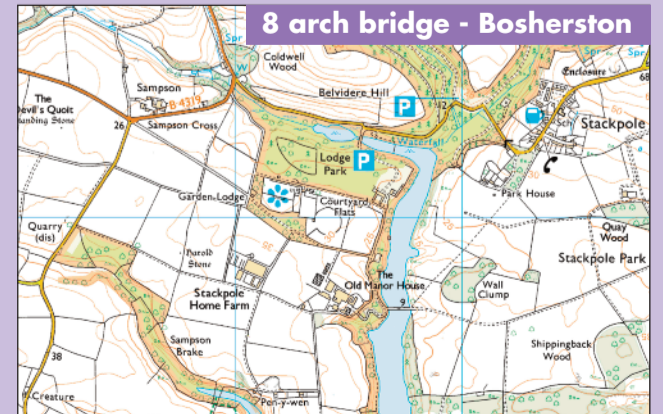
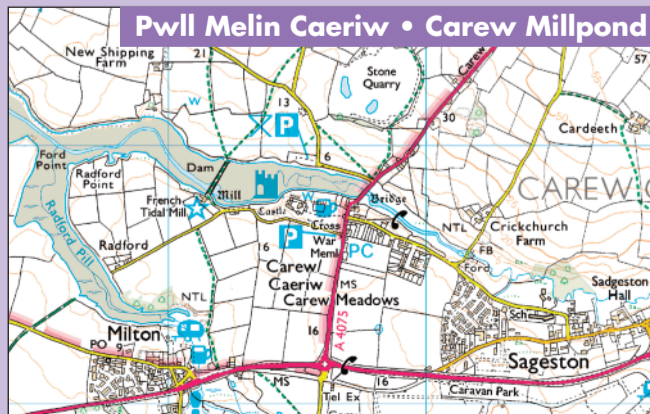

Bats find their way and find food by making high pitched squeaks. This is called **echolocation**. You can listen to these noises on special bat detectors.

- Common Pipistrelle (50kHz)
- Lesser Horseshoe (115 kHz)
- Brown Long-eared (45-50 kHz)
- Daubenton's (45-50kHz)
- Noctule (20 or 25 kHz)

Where and When

Bats are nocturnal. They are active throughout the night. Your best chance of spotting bats is on a still, dry spring or summer evening as they emerge from their roosts to feed near fresh water, hedgerows or large trees. Bats hibernate over the winter months. These places are good spots for bats. If you don't want to travel just go for a walk in a sheltered lane and keep your eyes and ears open.
